The annual summit between the Prime Minister of India and the President of Russia is the highest institutional dialogue mechanism in the strategic partnership between the two countries.

FLAGS OF INDIA AND RUSSIA PROJECTED ON OSTAKINO TV TOWER IN MOSCOW AS PM MODI BEGINS HIGH-PROFILE VISIT: ONE of Moscow’s landmarks, the Ostakino TV tower, was lit up in the colours of the flags of India and Russia on Monday as Prime Minister Narendra Modi began a two-day high-profile visit to the Russian capital to hold summit talks with President Vladimir Putin.

The Harbour corridor services were also suspended temporarily due to waterlogging at Chunnabhati.

Commuters complained the suburban services were running late. There was heavy rush of commuters at various stations and in trains. The CR officials said due to heavy rain and high tide in Mumbai, local train movement in the suburban section was affected and asked people to avoid travelling unless unavoidable.

The Western Railway said suburban trains were running up to 10 minutes late because water was above the track level between Matunga Road and Dadar due to heavy showers.

Progress of monsoon: July begins on promising note after dry June

NEW DELHI, July 8 (IANS)

SIGNALLING a normal monsoon ahead, the cumulative rainfall reached 1 per cent above the long-term average (as on July 6) while weekly rainfall (as on July 3) was 32 per cent above the long-term average in the country, a report showed on Monday.

Spatial divergence has reduced with most of the country receiving healthy rains during the last week.

North and West India (3 per cent), Central India (-6 per cent), East and

North East India (0 per cent), and the southern peninsula (13 per cent) have now all had normal rains so far, according to the report by Emkay Global Financial Services.

“With June having ended in deficit, it is imperative that July sees healthy rainfall and the month has begun on a promising note,” said Madhavi Arora, Lead Economist, Emkay Global Financial Services. While sowing was delayed, it has now picked up and is better than last year. “Total area under sowing (24.1 million hectare), as on June 28, is

sharply higher (33 per cent YoY) than last year. This is mainly due to accelerated sowing of pulses and oilseeds,” the report noted. Rice sowing area is the same as last year thus far whereas sugarcane is better. Among non-food crops, cotton sowing is much higher. Overall area under sowing is at 22 per cent of normal area sown, compared with 18.6 per cent at the same point in 2023. “July is extremely important in this regard with nearly 80 per cent of sowing activity completed by the end of the month,” said Arora.

MUMBAI, July 8 (IANS)

A MAGISTRATE’S court in Mumbai’s court on Monday sent ruling Shiv Sena leader Rajesh Shah, arrested in connection with the BMW hit-and-run case involving his son Mihir R Shah which killed fisherwoman Kaveri P Nakhwa, to 14 days judicial custody and then granted him bail, while his driver Rajrishi Bidawat has been sent to one-day police custody.

Mihir Shah is still absconding with half a dozen police teams hot on his trail in Mumbai and surrounding districts where he may be holed up.

The Worli Police had arrested Rajesh Shah and Bidawat – the latter was present in the BMW with a reportedly drunk Mihir Shah allegedly at the wheel and driving at high speed when it rammed into a scooter on which Pradipt Nakhwa and his wife Kaveri were riding home after buying fish at Sassoon Dock in Colaba. Rajesh Shah and his driver were charged with destruction of evidence, helping the prime accused Mihir Shah flee after the accident with several phone calls

made after the accident and other offences. However, shortly afterwards, Rajesh Shah moved a bail application and he was granted a provisional bail of Rs 15,000.

The BMW hit-and-run sparked public and political furore prompting Chief Minister Eknath Shinde to ensure justice for the victims and not sparing anybody responsible for the accident. Rajesh Shah is a Deputy Leader of the ruling Shinde-led Shiv Sena in Palghar district.

Committee to oversee appointment of VCs for State-run varsities in W Bengal

NEW DELHI, July 8 (PTI)

THE Supreme Court on Monday appointed former Chief Justice of India U U Lalit to head a search-cum-selection committee to oversee the appointments of vice-chancellors for State-run universities in West Bengal.

The ruling TMC dispensation has a running feud with West Bengal Governor C V Ananda Bose, who is also the Chancellor of State-run universities, over how the State’s universities should be run.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan directed that

the committee be constituted within two weeks after noting that both the State and the office of the Governor agreed on the formation of the panel. Besides Justice Lalit, the committee will comprise five members, who will prepare a panel of three names in an alphabetical order for appointment of vice-chancellors in each university.

The time period prescribed for completing the entire process is three months, the apex court said. The apex court said the committee’s recommendations, endorsed by the chairperson, will be presented to the Chief

Minister. “If the CM finds any candidate unsuitable, the supporting material and remarks will be forwarded to the Chancellor (Governor) within two weeks,” the bench said.

The committee’s remuneration will be borne by the State and former CJI Lalit will receive Rs three lakh per effective meeting of the committee.

The West Bengal Assembly had passed an amendment bill raising the number of members in the search committee set up for appointing vice-chancellors in State-run universities from three to five.

Delhi Police oppose Bibhav’s plea challenging arrest in Maliwal case

NEW DELHI, July 8 (PTI)

DELHI Police on Monday opposed in Delhi High Court a plea by Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal’s aide Bibhav Kumar, challenging his arrest in connection with the alleged assault on AAP MP Swati Maliwal.

The police submitted Kumar was not arrested “in haste” and that it had not faulted in any manner.

Contending that his arrest was illegal, Kumar’s counsel said there was a delay in lodging the FIR and he was arrested on May 18, the day he gave an application to the police to voluntarily join the investigation. Justice Neena Bansal Krishna, after hearing the arguments of both sides,

reserved the order. The counsel representing Kumar contended that he was picked up illegally from the residence of the Chief Minister without any prior notice.

The Delhi Police’s counsel argued that this was not the first criminal case lodged against Kumar.

The Noida Police had earlier lodged an FIR against him, he stated. He argued that Kumar formatted his mobile phone which amounted to tampering of evidence and added that serious allegations were levelled against the investigating agency by the accused and, if such things were permitted, it would be difficult for the authorities to proceed in matters in future.

HIGHLIGHTING the recent spate of heatwave in India and frequent extreme weather events worldwide, President Droupadi Murmu asked people on Monday to take “smaller” and “local” steps to protect the environment for a better tomorrow.

A day after participating in the annual Rath Yatra, Murmu spent some time on the beach in this holy city and later, penned her thoughts about the experience of being in close communion with nature, a statement issued by the Rashtrapati Bhavan said. In a post on ‘X’, she said oceans and the rich variety of flora and fauna have suffered heavily due to pollution but people living in nature’s lap have sustained traditions “that can show us the way” to conserve the environment. “Inhabitants of coastal areas, for example, know the language of the winds and waves of the sea. Following our ancestors, they worship the sea as God,” Murmu said while suggesting ways to protect and conserve the environment. The President began her four-day tour of Odisha on July 6. “There are places that bring us in closer touch with the essence of life and remind us that we are part of nature. Mountains, forests, rivers and seashores appeal to something deep within us. As I walked along the seashore today, I felt a communion with the surroundings – the gentle wind, the roar of the waves, and the immense expanse of water. It was a meditative experience,” she said.
